As a reminder, please note that in fall 2018 the Graduate College moved from a two deposit to a single deposit model for thesis and dissertation submission. In spring 2019, the final exam deadline (i.e., defense deadline) is April 12th, 2019. This is the date by when final exam reports are due to the Graduate College. **This date is slightly earlier than in previous spring semesters.** The single deposit deadline is April 19th, 2019. NHC 2019 Summer (Funded) Residency Program for PhD Students in the Humanities

Thursday, March 28, 2019 - deadline to apply - The Graduate College is sponsoring nominees for this two-week residency July 15-26, 2019 at the National Humanities Center. The PhD students nominated by the twenty-eight participating universities will meet at the National Humanities Center aimed at building bridges between the academic world and the classroom by translating research into practice. The University of lowa's designated nominees will receive \$1,750 for tuition, \$2,000 to cover lodging during the two-week residency, and up to \$700 to cover travel to the NHC.
